Cable Installation

Before the installation and use, please read carefully the relevant content in "Warning and Safety instructions".

1. Take out the TV from the wrapping package and put it in a drafty and flat place.

NOTE:

- When you plug or unplug the power cable, you must make sure that the TV, computer or
 other equipment have been already shut down. When unplugging the power cable or
 signal cable, please hold the plug (the insulated part). Do not draw the body of the cable.
- 2. **HDMI**: Supports AV devices with an HDMI connector (such as set-top box, DVD player, digital TV set, etc.).HDMI is also called as high-definition multimedia interface, and it can transmit digital audio and video signal with one cable.

NOTE:

While connecting the HDMI, make sure to avoid overexertion as the pin might break.

- ANT: Used to connect the antenna or the cable TV network, and receives outdoor antenna signals or closed circuit TV signals.
- 4. PC: Connect one end of the VGA cable to the VGA port on computer, connect the other end of the VGA cable to the VGA port on the TV, and tighten the bolts clockwise on the each end of VGA cable.

NOTE:

While connecting the 15-pin VGA, make sure to avoid overexertion as the pin might break.

AV IN: The output AV terminal of DVD can be connected with the AV input port of the TV through AV cable.

NOTE:

If AV works as mini terminal, please choose to use a one-to-three audio & video cable.

- 6. USB2.0: USB port is used to connect USB devices such as USB Disk.
- 7. **DIGITAL AUDIO OUT:** Sends the TV's digital audio signal to external audio equipment via the Digital Audio Output port.
- 8. **HEAD PHONE**: Connect a 3.5mm headphone for personal audio.
- 9. (b):Press to turn on the TV's power on/off.
- 10. Connect the power cable with 100-240V power supply

NOTE:

- ♦ The range of power input for the TV is 100-240V~ 50/60Hz. Do not connect the TV power input port with the power cable out of the above range.
- Please hold the insulated part of the plug when you are unplugging the power cable. Do
 not touch directly the metallic part of the cable directly.


Using the Remote Control

When using the remote control, aim it at remote sensor on the television. If there is an object between the remote control and the remote sensor on the unit, the unit may not operate.

- ♦ Point the remote control at the REMOTE SENSOR located on the television.
- When using this television in a very brightly lit area, the infrared REMOTE CONTROL SENSOR may not work properly.
- ♦ The recommended effective distance for using the remote control is about 7 meters.

Installing Batteries in the Remote Control

- 1. Open the cover at the back of the remote control.
- Install two AAA size batteries. Make sure to match the "+" and "-" ends of the batteries with the diagram inside the compartment.
- 3. Put back the cover.



Battery Replacement

You will need to install the batteries into the remote control to make it operate. Follow the instructions below.

When the batteries become weak, the operating distance of the remote control will be greatly reduced and you will need to replace the batteries.

Notes on Using Batteries:


The use of the wrong type of batteries may cause chemical leakage and/or explosion. Please note the following:

- Always ensure that the batteries are inserted with the + and terminals in the correct direction as shown in the battery compartment.
- Different types of batteries have different characteristics. Do not mix different types.
- Do not mix old and new batteries. Mixing old and new batteries will shorten battery life and/or cause chemical leakage.
- Replace batteries as soon as they do not work.
- Chemicals which leak from batteries may cause skin irritation. If any chemical matter seeps out of the batteries, wipe it up immediately with a dry cloth.
- The batteries may have a shorter life expectancy due to storage conditions. Remove the batteries whenever you anticipate that the remote control will not be used for an extended period.
- The batteries (battery pack or batteries installed) shall not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or etc.

CAUTION:

- It may result in an explosion if batteries are replaced incorrectly.
- Replace batteries with the same or equivalent type only

The buttons of the original remote control are as following:



Definition of the buttons on remote control:

- 1. POWER: Turn the TV set on/off.
- 2. Mitte or restore sound
- NUMBER BUTTONS: Use to choose channels (in TV mode)
- 4. SOURCE: Select signal source.
- 5. **INFO**: Show info of current program.
- P. MODE: Press to change the picture mode.
- S. MODE: Press to change the sound mode
- 8. ENTER: Select or confirm menu item.
- 9. ▲/ ▼/ 4/ ▶ : Select direction.
- MENU: Press to display/hide the on-screen menus or to quit some operations.
- 11. EXIT: Quit the current interface.
- 12. **LIST**: Press to call up the channel list. Press again to exit.
- 13. **VOL+/VOL-**: Increase/Decrease audio volume.
- CH^/CHv: Scroll to next/previous channel.
- 15. SLEEP: Set the sleep timer.
- 16. USB: Set the USB timer.
- 17. ▼: Press to display the Favorite program in TV mode. (You should setup your favorite channels in Program Edit menu)
- 19. **COLOUR BUTTONS:** Red/green/yellow/blue key navigation link.
- 20. **STILL:** Freeze or activate the current picture.
 - ■: STOP (in USB mode)
- 21. SUBTITLE: Enter the subtitle menu.
- 22. ▶ II: Play / Pause (in USB mode).
- 23. ***: Adjust displayable aspect ratio.
- 24. **∢**: Fast reverse (in USB mode)
 - ▶: Fast forward (in USB mode)
 - ₩: Previous (in USB mode)
 - ▶ : Next (in USB mode)

All pictures in this manual are examples, only for reference, actual product may differ from the pictures. The buttons not mentioned here are not used.

NOTE:

Turning on and off the tv

• Turn on the TV

Connect the TV to your mains socket.

If TV has a power switch, turn it on firstly. In standby mode, press Power button on the remote to turn on the TV.

Turn off the TV

Press the Power button on the remote control to enter standby mode. Do not leave your TV in standby mode for long periods of time. It is best to unplug the power cord.

NOTE:

- To ensure the normal use of the TV, the frequent turning on and off is forbidden. When
 there is an accidental power off, it is recommended to unplug the power cable from the
 power socket.
- No signal

During TV or external input mode, if there is no signal reception or external device is disconnected, the TV will automatically go to standby mode after approx. 15 minutes (In PC input mode: 1 minute).

Choosing a TV channel

Using the CHΛ/CHV on the remote control.

Press CHA to increase channel number.

Press CHv to decrease channel number.

• Using 0-9 digital buttons.

You can select the channel number by pressing 0 to 9.

Additionally, if any number button is pressed, the corresponding channel would be played and the TV will automatically switch to the TV mode.

Example

To select - channel (e.g. Channel 5): Press 5.

To select -- channel (e.g. Channel 20): Press 2 and 0 instantly

Volume Adjustment

- Press the VOL+/- button to adjust the volume.
- If you want to switch the sound OFF, press the d button.
- You can release mute by pressing the or increasing the volume.

Changing the Input Source

- You can select the input source by pressing the SOURCE button on the remote control.
- Press the arrow button to cycle through the input source, and press the ENTER button to confirm your choice.

Before using the TV follow the steps below to learn how to navigate the menu in order to select and adjust different functions. The access step may differ depending on the selected menu.

- 1. Press MENU button to display the main menu.
- 2. Press ∢ / ▶ button to cycle through the main menu.
- 3. Press the ▲/▼ button to select the desired sub item.
- 4. Press the ENTER button to access the submenu.
- 5. Press the A/\(\nspace / \sigma / \sigma / \sigma b \) buttons to select the desired value. The adjustment in the OSD may differ depending on the selected menu.
- 6. Press the **MENU** button to return to the previous menu.
- 7. Press the **EXIT** button to exit from the menu.

NOTE:

- When an item in MENU is displayed in grey, it means that the item is not available or cannot be adjusted.
- Some items in the menus may be hidden depending on modes or signal sources used.



Channel Menu

Auto Tuning: Press the ENTER button to start Auto Tuning which automatically scan and store all available programmes.

ATV Manual Tuning: Manual store for ATV channels.

Current CH: Set the channel number.
Color system: Select the color system.
Sound System: Select the sound system.

Fine-Turn: Adjust the frequency of the channel finely.

AFC: Automatic Fine Tuning.

Search: Press the ◆ button to search down from the current frequency, and press the ▶ button to search up.



Programme Edit

Press the ▲/▼ buttons to select the Programme Edit, then press the ENTER button to enter sub-menu.

First press the A/ buttons to highlight the channel you want to delete, skip, rename or move, then:

Press the **RED** button to delete the channel.

Press the GREEN button to rename the channel.

Press the YELLOW button to set the channel to moving state.


then press the _ / - buttons to move it to the position you want to put.

Press the **BLUE** button to skip the selected channel, (Your TV

set will skip the channel automatically when using CH \(\Lambda/\text{CHV}\) to view the channels.)

Press the \psi button to add or delete the channel in your favorite list.

Picture Menu



- **Picture Mode:** You can select the type of picture which best corresponds to your viewing requirements. Contrast, Brightness, Color, Tint and Sharpness can be adjusted when the picture mode is set to User.
- Contrast: Adjust the white level of the picture.
- Brightness: Adjust darkness of black sections in the picture.
- Color: Adjust the color intensity of the picture.
- Tint: Adjust the hue of the picture. (Only in the NTSC mode)
- Sharpness: Object edges are enhanced for picture detail.
- Color Temperature: Select the color temperature that you feel comfortable to watch.
- Noise Reduction: Reduces the picture noise in a weak broadcast signal.

Sound Menu




- Sound Mode: You can select a sound mode to suit your personal preferences.
 Five-stage equalization setting can be adjusted when the sound mode is set to User.
- Five-stage equalization setting: Press the ▲/▼ button to select: 120 Hz, 200Hz 500 Hz, 3 KHz, or 12 KHz, and then press the left / right button to adjust the frequency equalization of the sound.
- Balance: Adjust the level of sound coming from the left and right speakers.
- Auto Volume: Auto Volume automatically remains on the same level of volume if you change programmes. Each broadcasting station has its own signal conditions, volume adjustment may be needed every time when the channel is changed. This feature allows users to enjoy stable volume levels by making automatic adjustments for each program.
- SPDIF Mode: You can select the SPDIF Mode.

Time Menu



- Clock: Edit the time of the TV.
- Sleep Timer: Select the time to turn the TV to standby mode automatically. To cancel the Sleep Timer, set it to "Off".
- Auto Sleep: Select the time in hours (off, 3H, 4H, 5H) that you want your TV to remain switched on after your last operation. Cancel by setting it to "Off".
- OSD Timer: Select the time in seconds (5s, 15s, 30s) that you want the On-Screen Menu remains display after your last operation.

Setup Menu



- OSD Language: Select your preferred On Screen Display language.
- Aspect Ratio: You can select the picture size which best corresponds to your viewing requirements.
- Key Lock: Lock or unlock the key panel buttons on the TV. Press the 4 / ▶ buttons to select On or Off.
- Reset: Restore the default setting.
- Software Update (USB): Update the software using the USB memory device. Please be careful not to disconnect the power or remove the USB drive until updates are completed.
- Health Remind: Switch the Health Remind on or off. When Health Remind is set to On, a prompt picture will remind you to have a break at intervals of two hours.

Screen Menu (in PC mode)



- 1. Press the MENU button to call up the SCREEN menu.
- 2. Press A/W buttons to select the option that you want to adjust in the **SCREEN** menu.
- 3. Press ENTER button to adjust.
- Auto Adjust: To adjust all the PC settings automatically.
- Horizontal Pos.: To adjust the horizontal placing of the image.
- Vertical Pos.: To adjust the vertical placing of the image.
- Clock: Eliminates the vertical (Clock) interfering lines.
- Phase: To adjust the phase of the image.

USB Operation

- · First, insert a USB memory device into the USB port.
- Press the SOURCE button to call up the Signal Source Selection menu. Use the A/v to
 highlight USB, and the ENTER button to access the USB mode. You may also use the
 signal source selection menu to exit from the USB mode.

NOTE:

- Special USB device may not be well supported.
- USB max, Load: DC5V 500mA.
- The formats supported

The USB function can support the USB device with USB memory.

It can play PHOTO, MUSIC, MOVIE or TEXT files.

Photo Format Support: JPEG, BMP, PNG. Music Format Support: MP3. M4A AAC.

Movie Format Support: MPG. Text Format Support: TXT.

Main Operating Interface



Basic operation

- Use the ◀/▶ buttons to select PHOTO, MUSIC, MOVIE or TEXT. Press ENTER button enter into sub-menu.
- 2. Use the arrow buttons and **ENTER** button to enter the desired disk. Press **ENTER** to open the folder.
- 3. Use the arrow buttons to highlight the file. Press ▶ II button to play the selected files.
- 4. Press the to stop the playing files.
- 5. Press **EXIT** button to return to the previous menu or to exit menu.

When playing Photo files:



- Press the INFO button on the remote control to hide/display the on-screen toolbar.
- Use the 4 / b buttons, then press ENTER to select a function such as Previous, Next, Rotate, Enlarge from the on-screen toolbar.
- Press or EXIT buttons to exit playback & go back to file list page.

When playing Music files:



- · Press the INFO button on the remote control to hide/display the on-screen toolbar.
- Use the ∢ / ▶ buttons, then press ENTER to select a function such as Previous, Next, +
 Play, Pause from the on-screen toolbar.
- Press or EXIT buttons to exit playback & go back to file list page.

When playing Movie files:



- · Press the INFO button on the remote control to hide/display the on-screen toolbar.
- Use the 4 / buttons, then press ENTER to select a function such as Play, Pause, Previous File, Next File from the on-screen toolbar,
- Press or EXIT buttons to exit playback & go back to file list page.

When playing Text files:



- Press the INFO button on the remote control to hide/display the on-screen toolbar.
- Use the ◀ / ▶ buttons, then press ENTER to select a function such as Play, Pause, Previous File, Next File from the on-screen toolbar.
- Press or EXIT buttons to exit playback & go back to file list page.

NOTE:

 To play your multimedia files, make sure you have selected the correct icon in the main media playback menu.

Channel List

Press LIST button to display the Channel List.

Press the 4 / > buttons to select the channel and press ENTER to watch it.

Press LIST/EXIT button to exit the channel list



Favourite List

Press button to display the Favourite List. (You should setup your favourite channels in Program Edit menu)

Press the $\sqrt{\ }$ buttons to select the channel and press **ENTER** to watch it.

Press **EXIT** button to exit the favourite list.

Maintenance

Early malfunctions can be prevented. Careful and regular cleaning can extend the life of your new TV. Be sure to turn the power off and unplug the power cord before you begin any cleaning.

Cleaning the screen

- 1. Here's a great way to keep the dust off your screen for a while. Wet a soft cloth in a mixture of lukewarm water and a little fabric softener or dish washing detergent. Wring the cloth until it's almost dry, and then used it to wipe the screen.
- 2. Make sure the excess water is off the screen, and then let it air-dry before you turn on your TV.

Cleaning the cabinet

To remove dirt or dust, wipe the cabinet with a soft, dry, lint-free cloth. Please be sure not to use a wet cloth.

Extended Absence

If you expect to leave your TV dormant for a long time (such as a vacation), it's a good idea to unplug the power cord to protect against possible damage from lightning or power surges.

Disposal of old electrical appliances



The European directive 2012/19/EU on Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE), requires that old household electrical appliances must not be disposed of in the normal unsorted municipal waste stream. Old appliances must be collected separately in order to optimize the recovery and recycling of the materials they
